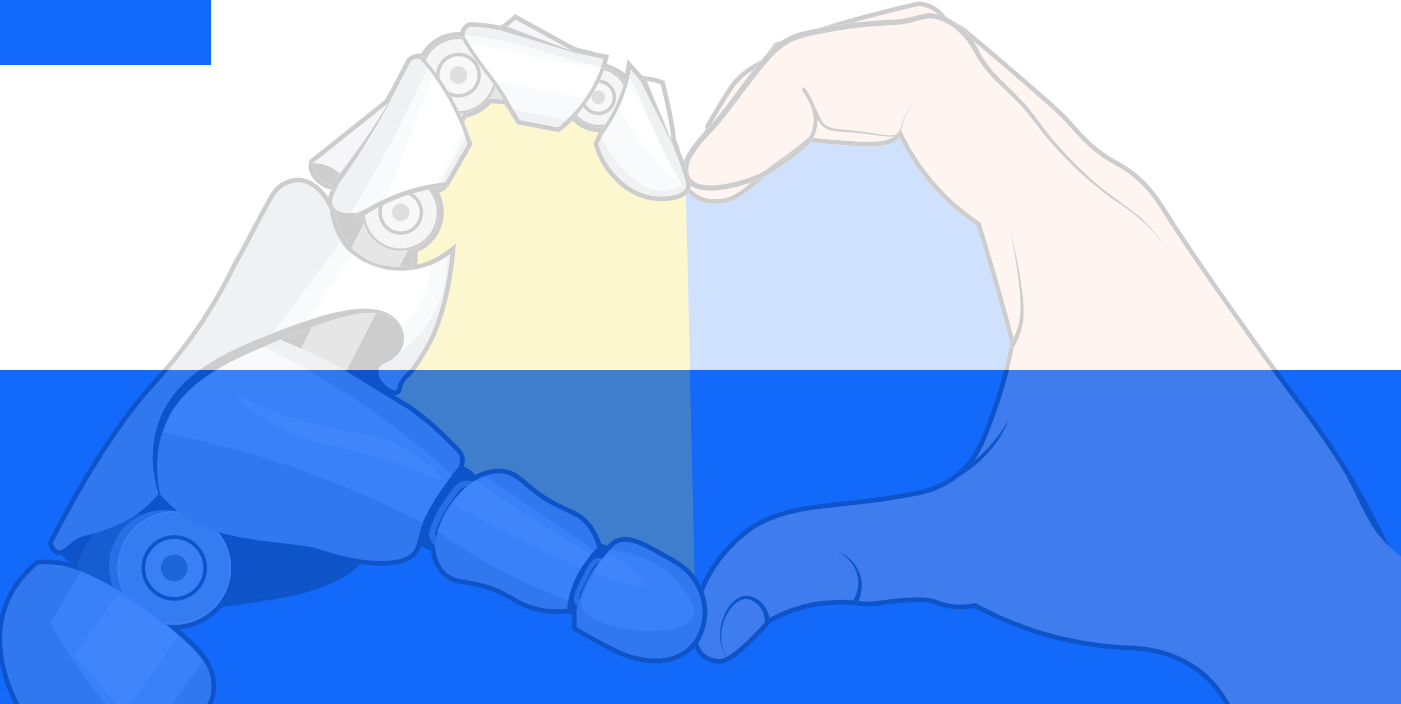

REHABILITATION

The Foundation provides funding for **SPECIALIZED REHABILITATION** for defenders who have sustained extremely severe injuries including limb amputations, spinal injuries, traumatic brain injuries, and other serious conditions — as well as support for their family members in restoring their health.

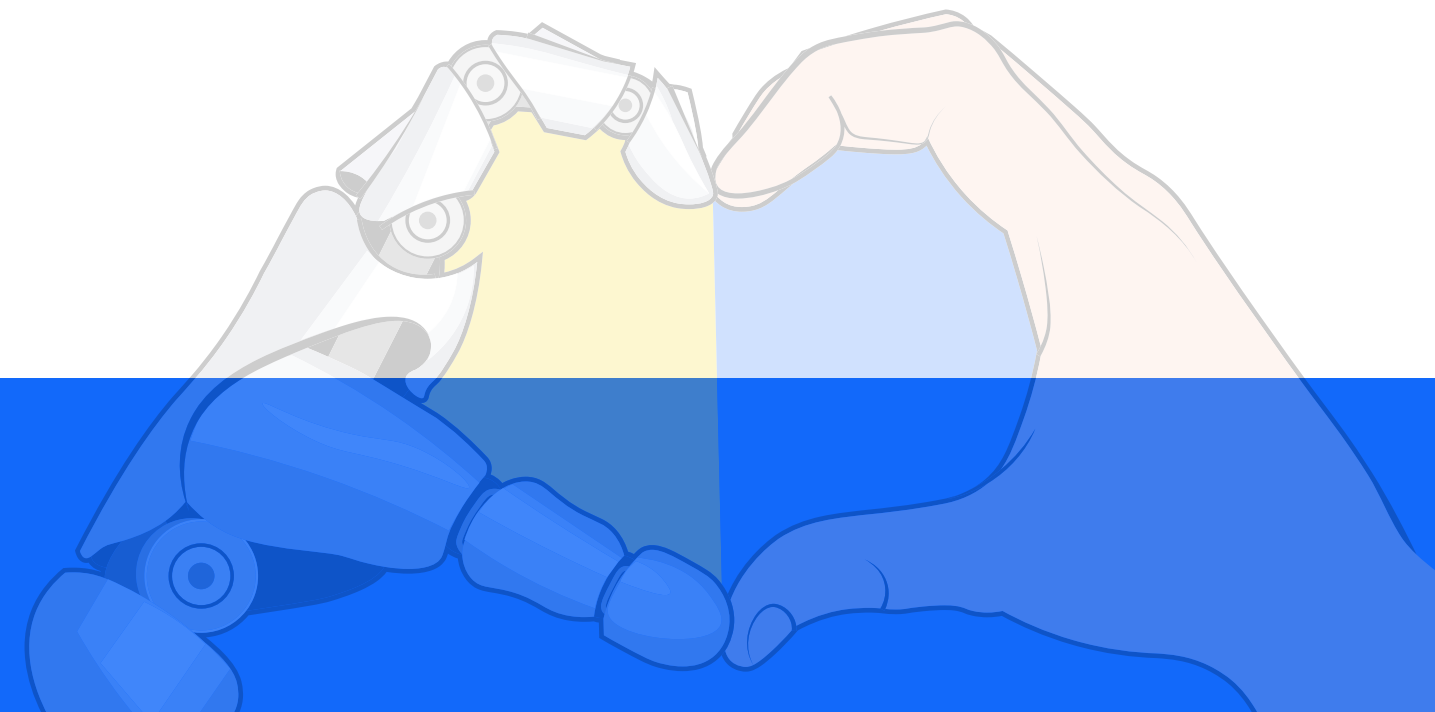
With the support of the International Renaissance Foundation, in 2025 we launched a new area of work — **SUPPORT FOR FAMILY MEMBERS** of fallen and missing defenders, including comprehensive physical and psychological rehabilitation, group sports activities, and educational-therapeutic events.

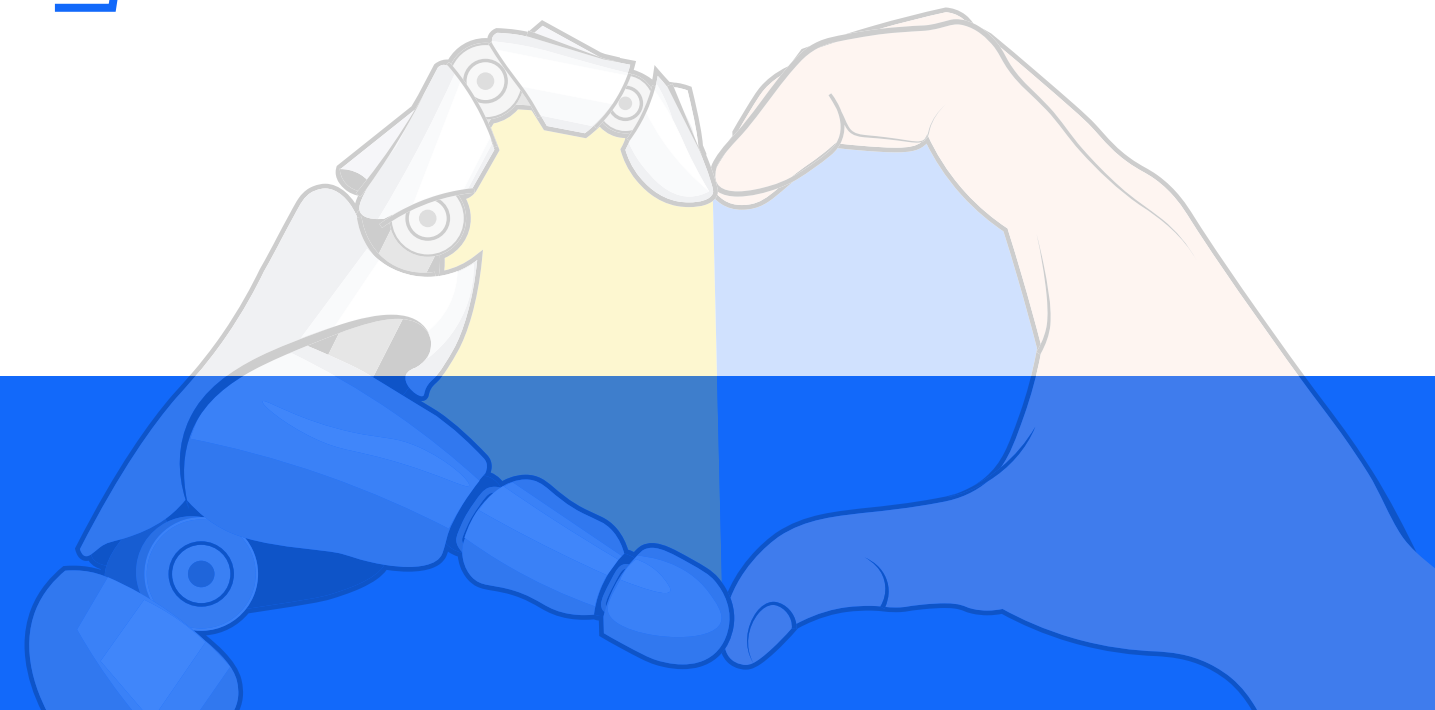
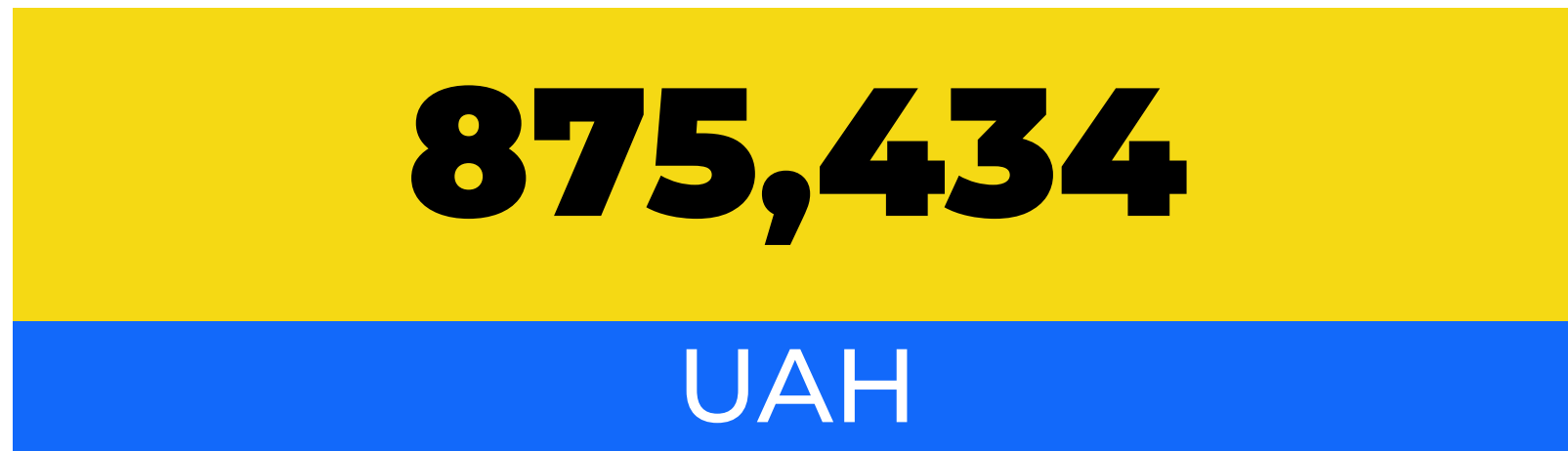

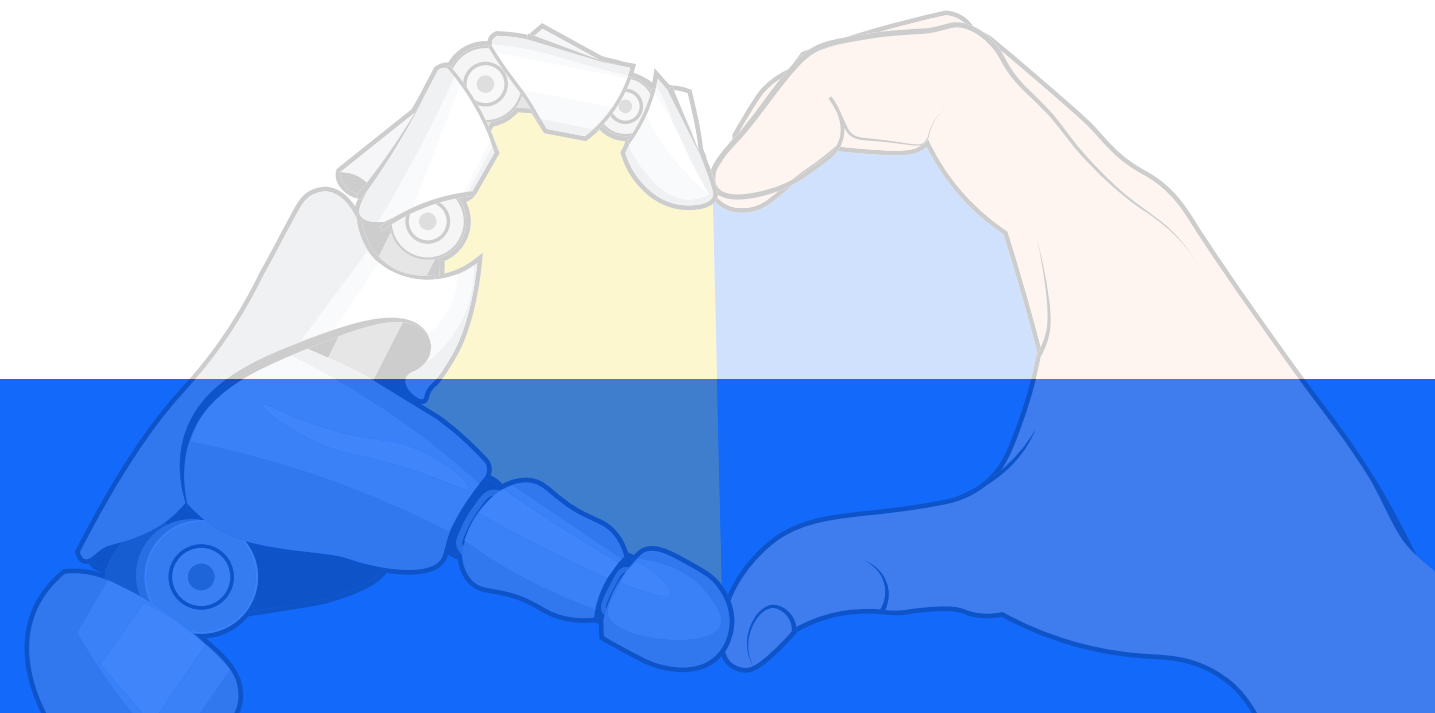
The Foundation provided beneficiaries with high-quality endoprotheses, implants, metal constructions, spinal systems, neurostimulators, etc.

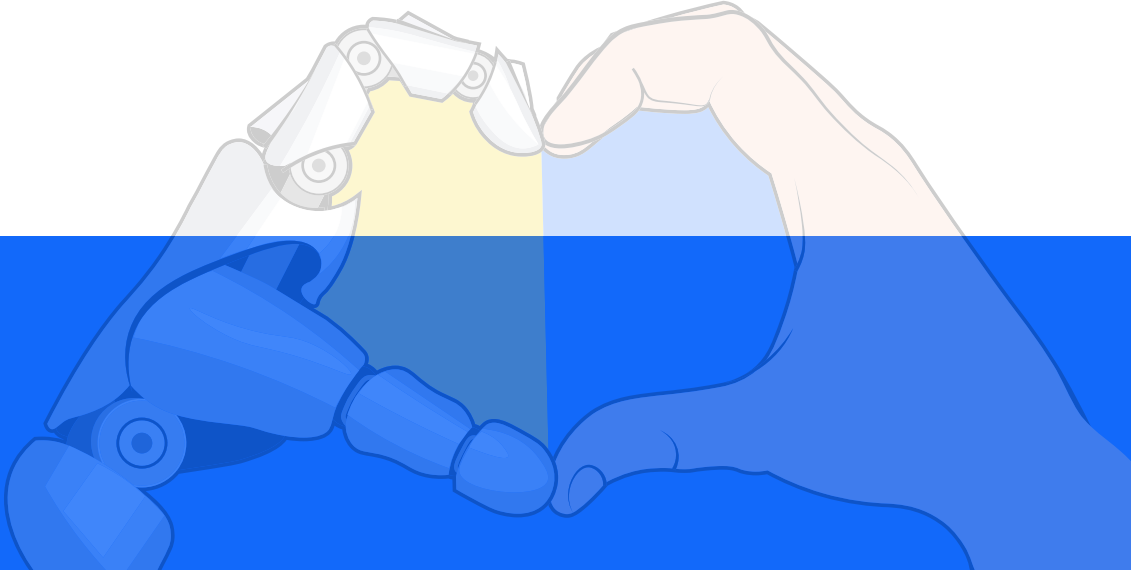
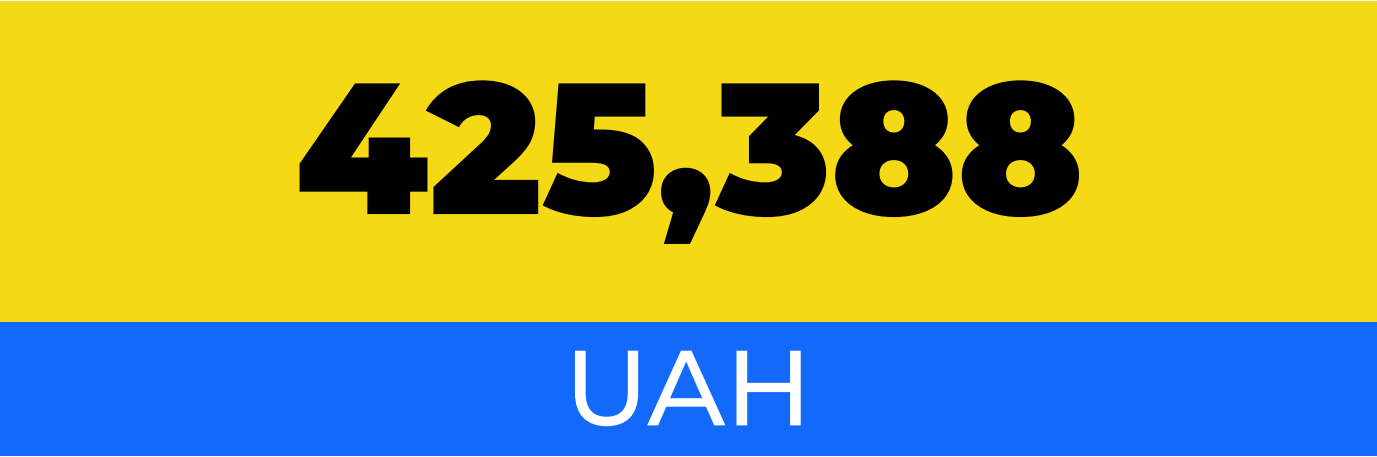

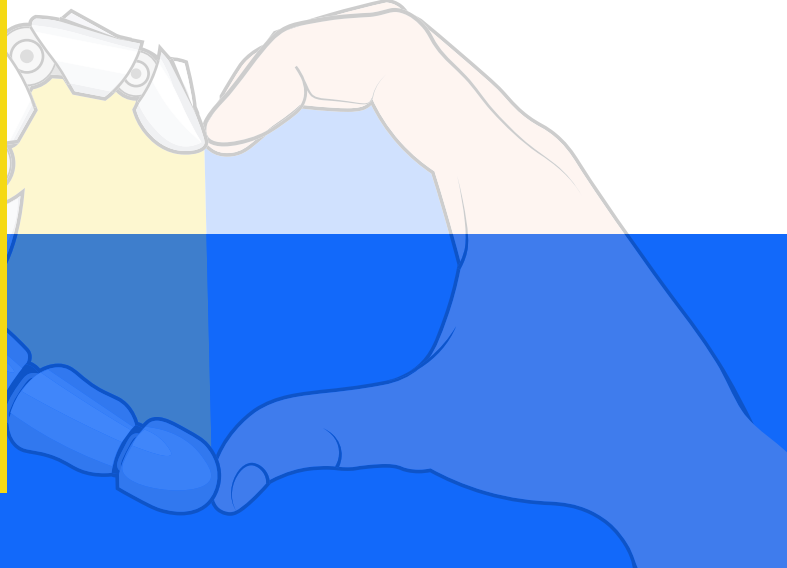

Yaroslav Ivanets, call sign YARIK

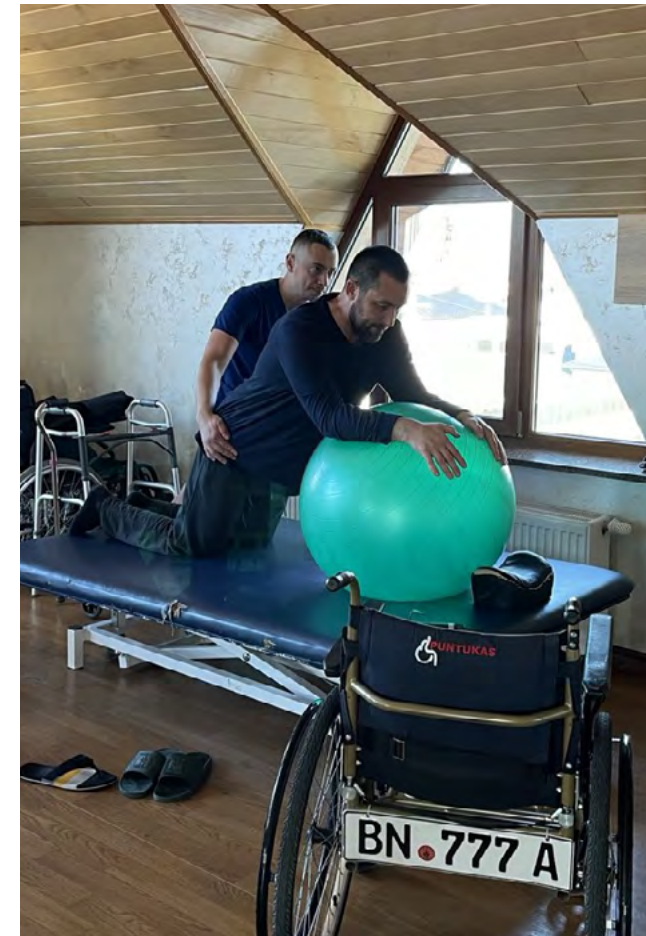

Veteran of the State Border Guard Service of Ukraine, participant in the ATO and the full-scale war. In civilian life, he was a school teacher. He returned to the front in the first days of the invasion, fought in the north and east, and went through the hell of Bakhmut. During battles in the Donetsk region, he sustained a severe spinal injury. He survived thanks to his endurance and the coordinated actions of his comrades. He underwent 9 complex surgeries and suffered constant neuropathic pain, forcing him to lie down 90% of the time.

The Foundation helped raise funds and purchase a neurostimulator, which reduced pain and enabled him to begin rehabilitation. Yarik dreams of teaching again. Thanks to the support provided, he now has this chance.

A sapper of the Armed Forces of Ukraine who held the hottest directions for two years without rotation. Avdiivka, awarded by the President. In February 2024 a hostile drone strike. Mine-blast trauma, shrapnel wounds, stroke, paralysis, loss of speech. He survived and began a new battle for himself.

The Foundation raised funds and paid for three full rehabilitation courses at the Western Rehabilitation and Sports Center. Maksym now walks without an orthosis, orients himself in space, cooks independently, and is restoring his speech. His journey continues. But now he has what matters most — hope and support. Because behind every number in the report is not statistics, but a courageous defender and a real life that has been preserved.

Daryna, call sign MARA, 19 years old — a servicewoman of the National Guard of Ukraine, a fighter of the 13th NGU Brigade “Khartia.” In 2024, she voluntarily stepped up to defend the country, continuing her family’s military path. In April 2024, during shelling, she sustained a severe gunshot traumatic brain injury as a result of a cluster munition explosion. Before being wounded, she managed to provide assistance to several injured comrades. After a critical surgery, she spent 20 days in a coma, and upon waking was unable to speak or move.

The Foundation raised and transferred funds for long-term rehabilitation and also covered the production and replacement of orthoses for both legs. Thanks to this support, Daryna is regaining lost functions, taking her first independent steps, continuing rehabilitation, and leading an active life. During this time, she got married and is making ambitious plans for the future.

Anton Kuzio

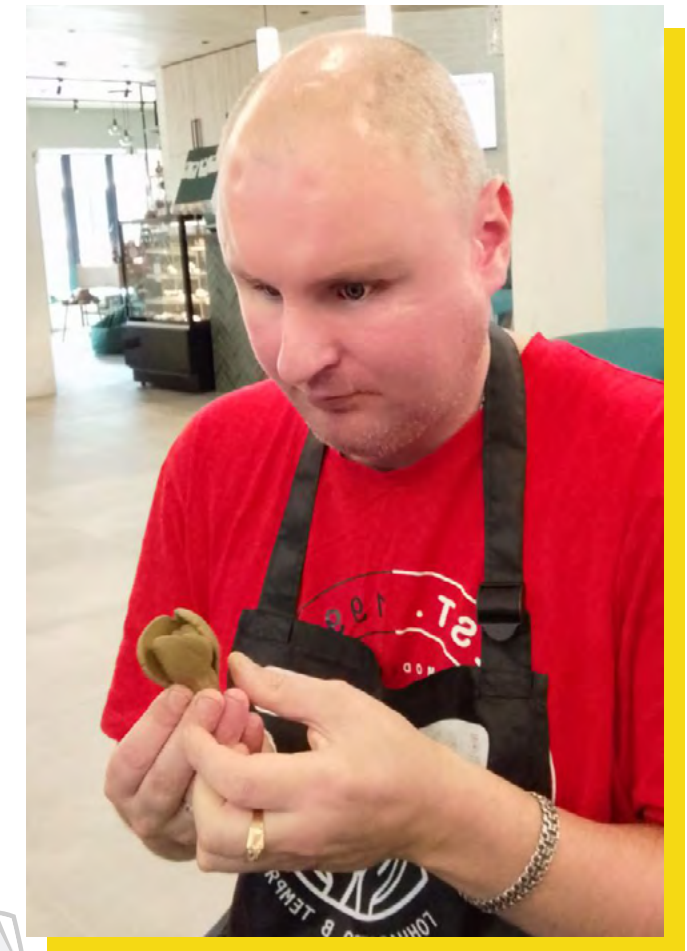

Anton Kuzio is a mortarman of the Armed Forces of Ukraine. In January 2024, on the Donetsk axis, during shelling by a guided aerial bomb, Anton sustained severe injuries. He survived, but completely lost his sight. The explosion caused multiple injuries. Anton underwent two craniotomies and a prolonged fight for his life.

After lengthy treatment, the key need became adaptation to life without sight. For this purpose, doctors recommended special Envision assistive glasses — a high-tech device that reads texts aloud, recognizes objects and faces, and helps with spatial orientation. The Foundation fully covered the cost of the glasses. This is not just a gadget, but a tool for returning to active life. The result is the opportunity to independently interact with the world, navigate in space, and feel independence.

Vitalii Kraievskyi, call sign VIT, voluntarily stepped up to defend Ukraine because he believed and still believes that our land is a place where freedom, not fear, must live. On December 1, 2024, he sustained an extremely severe injury — traumatic amputation of both lower limbs. Thanks to the actions of his comrades, Vitalii survived, but a new struggle lay ahead — to learn to live in a different body and regain control over it.

The Foundation financed 60 days of rehabilitation at the Western Rehabilitation and Sports Center of NCSIU. The result was not only physical, but life-changing. Vitalii confidently operates an active wheelchair, has significantly increased his strength and endurance, and his functional independence score rose from 36 to 84 out of 90 possible points. This course became the first step toward independence and a return to active life.

Yevhenii Sytnyk, call sign ZHEKA, at the beginning of the full-scale invasion, without hesitation returned to Ukraine from abroad and joined the Armed Forces of Ukraine. On August 23, 2022, near Donetsk Airport, Yevhenii sustained a severe mine-blast injury—trauma to the head and both legs. After a coma, numerous surgeries, and months in hospitals, his condition remained critical. Doctors did not believe he would be able to speak, sit, or walk.

After treatment abroad and stabilization of his condition, the main need became specialized rehabilitation. The Foundation funded long-term rehabilitation at the Agape Center. After intensive work with specialists, Yevhenii began to restore his speech, coordination, and movement. He walks independently, recognizes his relatives, and is returning to life. There is still a long road ahead, but today each of his steps is proof that support works, and that behind every figure in the report stands a living person and real changes in their fate.

PROJECTS AND SUPPORT 2025

The project “Kharkiv — City of Cyborgs,” implemented with financial support from the International Renaissance Foundation, became an important growth point both for the Foundation and for the entire Kharkiv community. It strengthened cooperation between local initiatives, specialists, and institutions working with veterans and their families. Thanks to informational, coordination, and organizational activities, the community gained improved opportunities for veterans’ rehabilitation and integration. A separate value of the project was strengthening the Foundation’s organizational capacity. This made it possible to work more systematically, more effectively, and to scale assistance where it is truly needed.

Total budget: UAH 1,984,710

Duration: 14 months

Assistance provided to: more than 180 veterans and their family members

As part of the project, the photo **exhibition “In the Embrace of Strength”** was organized. The event was intended to demonstrate that every wounded service member is not only a hero, but also a loving father, husband, son, and friend who continues to live a full life thanks to the support of family and society.



Project “Rehabilitation of Cyborg Veterans” with financial support from CANADA-UKRAINE FOUNDATION

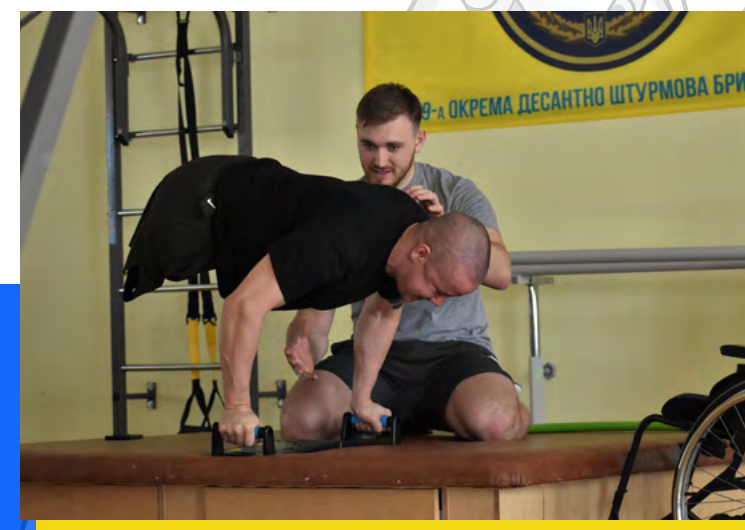
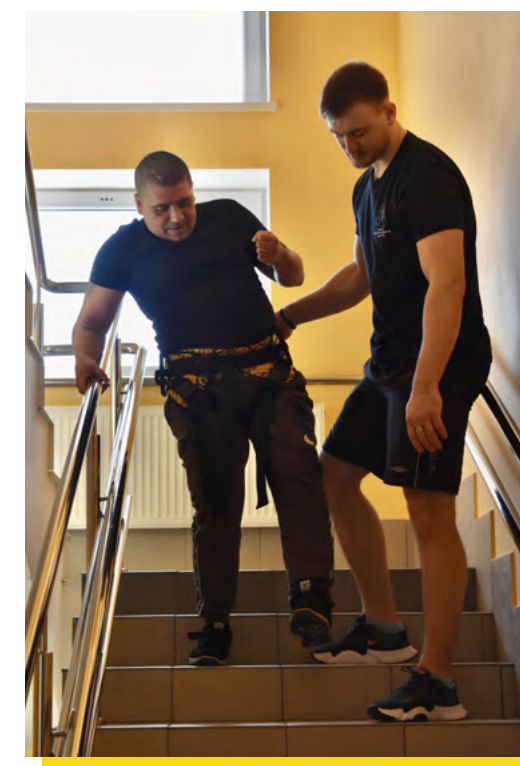
A unique comprehensive rehabilitation model was created for veterans and their families, combining specialized inpatient facilities, a medical and wellness center, and a swimming pool. A multidisciplinary approach made it possible to provide defenders with high-quality and professional rehabilitation services and demonstrated effective cooperation between the medical and civil sectors.

Project participants not only restored their physical and psychological health but also returned to active social life: they became members of the city’s amputee football team, headed veteran organizations, and joined the Foundation’s team.

Total budget: 133,040 USD

Duration: 12 months

**Assistance provided to: 142 beneficiaries,
including 12 family members**



Project “Implants for Cyborgs” with financial support from UKRAINE CHARITY

Aimed at providing severely wounded veterans with high-quality metal structures, endoprostheses, and other implants.

Total budget: 613,219.50 UAH

Duration: 3 months

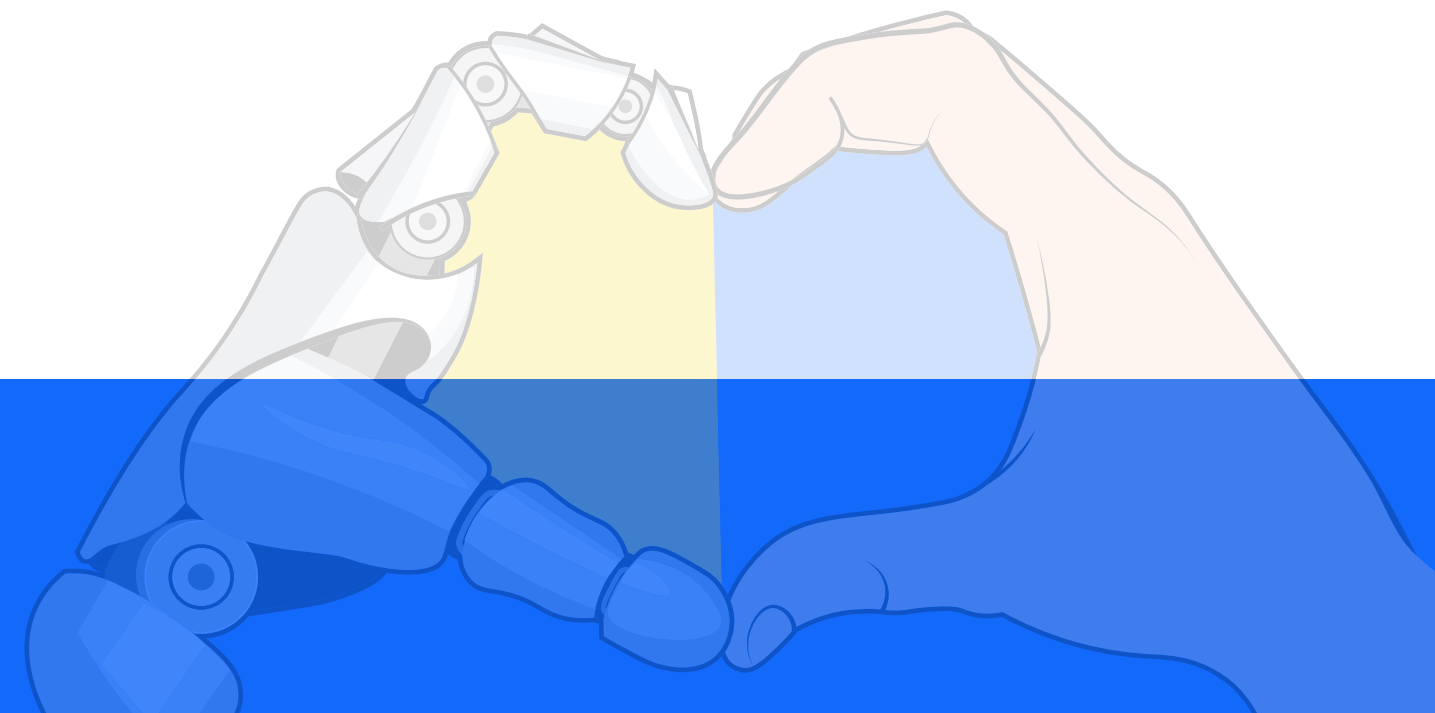
Purchased: 5 hip joint endoprostheses, 2 knee joint endoprostheses, 3 customized plates, 1 implant for fixation of the thoracolumbar spine.

Support from BRITISH-UKRAINIAN AID

Total amount of assistance: 7,582 GBP and 28,637.38 UAH

Thanks to the partner’s financial support:

- specialized rehabilitation was paid for 4 severely wounded veterans,
- a hip joint endoprosthesis was purchased.



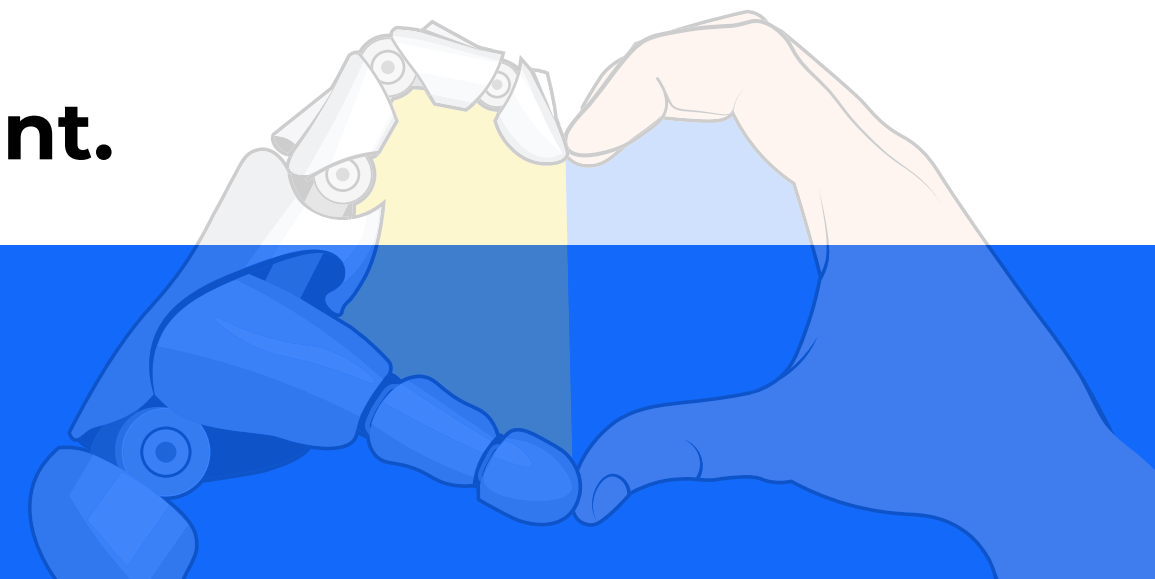
